M. A. Economics

A. About the Department:

Department of Economics came into existence in the first academic session of Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Bihar in 2016. The Department aims to provide an in-depth study of the theoretical propositions advocated by different schools of economics. The Department offers M.A. Economics and Ph. D. in Economics. The important areas of research are Macroeconomics, Financial Economics, Monetary Economics, Public Finance, International Economics, Experimental Economics, Environmental Economics, Industrial Economics, Agriculture Economics, Labour Economics and Development Economics. The department also offers General Elective courses open to all postgraduate students of the university at par with National Educational Policy and Choice Based Credit System.

B. Objectives of the Programme:

The MA Economics programme has been designed to go beyond the merely received and established truths and to make students exposed to various heterodox literatures to develop a critical understanding of various theories among them. In order to make the programme more pragmatic, the department aims at enabling the students to link economic theory with historical experiences and empirical observations.

The programme aims

• To provide an opportunity for the learners to learn fundamental courses in economics namely, microeconomics, macroeconomics, international economics and public finance in order to have in-depth knowledge of concepts pertaining to the courses.

- To enable the learners to learn introductory courses on mathematical and statistical methods used in the field of core and applied economics in order to have basic understanding required for further course of studies.
- To enable the learners in understanding basic and advanced courses on econometric tools and methods for in-depth knowledge of tools required in research and development of the subject.
- To enable the learners to explore the advanced courses namely, agricultural economics, financial economics, education economics, health economics, labour economics, industrial economics and environmental economics.
- To improve analytical skills of learners through computer skills, research methodology required for basic research in the field of pure and applied economics.
- To enable the learners to undertake the research and analytical assignments in their further course of studies.
- To enable learner to demonstrate professionalism, self-awareness, leadership and effective communication skills.
- To enable learners to use information and knowledge effectively through scanning, organizing, synthesizing and analysing various socio-economic data and share knowledge.
- To enable learners to conceptualise economics foundations to solve practical decision-making problems individually and as part of teams using different econometric techniques.

C. Outcome of the Programme:

After successfully completion of the course, the learners will be able to:

- Learn fundamental courses in economics namely, microeconomics, macroeconomics, international economics, and public finance in order to have in-depth knowledge of concepts pertaining to the courses.
- Learn introductory courses on mathematical and statistical methods used in the field of core and applied economics in order to have basic understanding required for further course of studies.
- Understand basic and advanced courses on econometric tools and methods for in-depth knowledge of tools required in research and development of the subject.
- Explore the advanced courses namely, agricultural economics, financial economics, education economics, health economics, labour economics, industrial economics and environmental economics as per the chosen specialization.
- Improve analytical skills through computer skills, research methodology required for basic research in the field of pure and applied economics.

- Demonstrate professionalism, self-awareness, leadership and effective communication skills.
- Use information and knowledge effectively through scanning, organizing, synthesizing and analysing various socio-economic data and share knowledge.
- Conceptualise economics foundations to solve practical decision-making problems individually and as part of teams using different econometric techniques.
- Demonstrate a critical awareness of current economic issues through research and practice in the field.

D. Nature of Courses:

S. No.	Nature of the Course	Course Code	Description of the course		
1.	Discipline Based Core Course	DBCC	This is the foundational course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete the Programme in a said discipline of study at PG level. This also includes the introductory course on research methodology, dissertation writing, project work, field work, lab work, Indian knowledge system, skill enhancement, value addition etc. related to the subject.		
2.	Discipline Based Core Elective Course	DBCE	This is the elective course, aimed at specializing the student in a particular sub-discipline of the concerned discipline. The students have choice to choose the course from a basket of DBCE to be offered in the concerned semester.		
3.	Open Elective (Interdisciplinary/ Multidisciplinary) Course	OEIC	This is the elective course, aimed to enable exposure to some other disciplines or domains. The students have to choose open elective courses from other departments of the university.		
4.	Mandatory Elective Non-Credit Course	MENC	This is the value-added course to promote multidisciplinary and holistic education among the students. The course is of non-credit nature but mandatory to complete successfully for the award of the Master's degree. The students have to choose the MENC courses, equivalent to at least 04 credits, from a basket of offered courses.

*Explanation:

- The Open Elective courses may be offered in any of the semester by the department.
- The Mandatory Elective Non-Credit Courses have no semester boundaries. The students will have full freedom to complete them in any of the semesters during the entire duration of the PG programme. The MENC courses will require only satisfactory completion and have no grading.
- The dissertation/project work **shall be assigned in the beginning of 3**rd **Semester** in view of providing enough time for students to carry out the research work. **However, the credit shall be counted in the last semester only.**
- The course catering the vocational component should be developed in such a way that it justifies Post-Graduate Diploma for those students who wish to exit after completion of two semesters of the PG programme.
- The Students, who are desirous to opt for PG Diploma in Economics, shall be awarded the same as per detailed guidelines issued by the University from time to time.
