- What is Ethics?
- A set of moral principles that define what is good and what is bad
- It involves honesty in your research project.
- Honesty towards yourself, before anyone else.

- What is research?
- studious inquiry or examination especially: investigation or experimentation aimed at the discovery and interpretation of facts, revision of accepted theories or laws in the light of new facts, or practical application of such new or revised theories or laws. -Merriam Webster

- Research endeavour is the endeavour to raise new questions or to develop new ways to look at the things, with detached view.
- At the same time, researcher never claims the finality for his observations.
- It is the field of intellectuals. Budhijivi. To think, and to keep thinking critically is a life time endeavour.
- Scholarship and money we take from government is given for the job of thinking. Thinking is different from taking tension. Chinta and Chintan.
- We owe it to the poor.

- Research is creative, but no creativity is possible without genuine interest.
- Creation is eternally new. Life evolves and new ideas come in. but to receive them, a person must be on creative wavelength that comes from being an authentic person.
- It is not only a thing of courage to stick to a new idea that challenges the conventions, but also a duty of a researcher.
- Ideas can never be created by force. Only authentic person can have new ideas.
- New ideas always challenge the conventions.

• Research is a creative process. It is artistic in nature. As curiosity is naturally ingrained in human-beings, research is a joyful and must be a joyful activity. If it is not joyful, one must critically check the reasons as they can be political or any kind of biasness.

• To find new facts, or to do fair investigations, a researcher must be free of preconceived notions. Or he must explain and critically analyse his own positon with respect to his methodology and tools and choices availed in the research project. This will define the limitations of the researcher.

- Limits to re-presentation:
- Limits to information.
- Limits to perception.
- Limits to communication.
- Limits to explanation.
- Limits to understanding.
- Limits to human creativity.

- More the boundaries, lesser the ethics.

- Plagiarism
- Forceful interpretation of data
- Not acknowledging the help
- Nepotism, sycophancy, political influence
- Doing research merely for degree or credits.
- Refusal to go to obvious explanations if they contradict your theory/ideology

- Dare to be original:
- It is your right
- It is your duty
- It is your responsibility towards next generation
- It is the only way to enjoy genuinely
