- Man slaughter was a major crime against the earth goddess in Ibo society
- \* The accused had to flee from his home and clan along with his family
- \* Eg. Okonkwo fled to Mbanta, a nearby village of his mother's kinsmen.
- ✤ His house was then ransacked and burnt as a part of the ritual of revenge for the earth goddess
- Okonkwo's crime was inadvertent so he could return after seven years of exile

#### URI/ENGAGEMENT CEREMONY

- ✤ Uri is a kind of engagement ceremony
- \* Eg. Obierika, Okonkwo's friend celebrates his daughter's Uri.
- $\clubsuit$  A lot of cooking for the feast
- ✤ Pots full of palm-wine

The ceremony would end with a lot of eating, drinking and singing and also a dance by the bride

✤ Okonkwo gets some medicinal leaves and Ezinma was given a steam-bath with boiled leaves which cured her of her shivering and fever

- Ekwefi lost nine of her children in infancy
- ✤ When a woman loses her children one after another. the Ibo people believe that it is the it is the same wicked child entering its mother's womb again and again.
- ✤ The cure lies in the hands of a medicine-man
- ✤ Okogbue, the medicine-man cured the Ekwefi of the curse and the next child, Ezinma, survived

## 'EVIL FOREST'

In 'evil forest' those who had died of dreadful diseases like leprosy and small pox were buried.

 The people believed that anyone inhabiting such a place would himself be dead

\* Nothing happened to the missionaries after living there for many days,

✤ Villagers started believing that the god of the white men was more powerful than that of the Africans.

# SUICIDE

Finding himself completely isolated from the villagers, Okonkwo had committed suicide

The body of Okonkwo was hanging from a tree when the District
 Commissioner comes to arrest him

✤ His clan members refused to touch his body since it is sinful to touch someone who had taken his own life

\* Not buried as per the normal customs and rituals.

#### HOW DISPUTES ARE RESOLVED IN IBO

✤ Disputes between the people of nine villages of Umuofia are resolved at the hands of a group of nine adjudicators

\* The nine adjudicators represent the spirits of the ancestors collectively and who are called **Egwugwu**,

✤ The adjudicators are from amongst the people and are transformed into Egwugwu after performing some rituals including the wearing of masks.
